FELLOWSHIP

The Christian life is to be lived as a cooperating member of a team. It cannot be lived out fully through personal discipleship and individual obedience. The principles of Fellowship (the heart attitudes and "one-anothers") must be practiced as a team not as a lone individual. God has called us to live in unity and harmony with one another— to love, forgive, encourage, share His word, and share our lives and possessions with others.

Disciples who follow Jesus...

- Desire to be involved in a community that focuses on God's word, prayer, witnessing, and fellowship. (from the Wheel Illustration) *Philippians 2:1-4*
- Value the goals and interests of others above their own. Philippians 2:4
- Desire for everyone to have fellowship with the body of believers. 1 John 1:3; Proverbs 27:17; Ecclesiastes 4:9-10
- Aspire to live an honest, open life before others. Ephesians 4:25
- Commit to clearing up relationships. Matthew 5:23-24, 18:15,35
